# LUTSEN MOUNTAINS

#### Ski Lutsen Mountain Feb. 23 - 26, 2012



I will get to the "vital statistics" of this year's ski trip momentarily. FIRST, WE HAVE TO DEAL WITH THE FACT THAT THE TRIP IS IN JEOPARDY. As we have indicated previously, we cannot do the trip financially if we do not have a minimum of 20 people. The cost of the bus simply does not allow it.

As of this date, we are short of the required 20 minimum skiers. Carol and I are making individual calls in search of "missing" skiers but we must find them by January 20, 2012 because we have to "lock" in our contracts by that date. YOU CAN HELP US. CHECK WITH YOUR FRIENDS TO SEE IF YOU CAN GET THEM TO COMMIT. Time is short so if you can help us (and yourself), please do so with a real sense of immediacy.

To help you in your "sales pitch", I will restate all of the essential information. Clearly, if you have already signed on or have been on the trip, you do not need this but for others, this will hopefully help them decide that this is a really great trip.

The dates for Lutsen this year are Feb. 23 through Feb. 26, 2012. We are repeating last year's format and we will ski Lutsen for 2 and ½ days with no stop at Spirit Mt. in Duluth. We have also arranged for a late checkout at Mountain Inn (our lodging) so you can ski half a day on Sunday, return to your room and change clothes and clean up for a comfortable ride home on the bus.

The following is our cost information:

\$465.00 per adult

This covers:

Bus transportation 3 nights of lodging 3 continental breakfasts 2 and ½ days of lift tickets Saturday night dinner

for each adult in a room with double occupancy. The full amount must be received by January 20, 2012. We will do our final count after mail on that date and make the "go vs no go" decision that evening.

We strongly **encourage children** on this trip and we will provide cost information (reduced as compared with adult costs) upon request and as soon as we know the age of the children.

The bus will leave Dutch Mill Park & Ride at 2 pm on Thursday, Feb. 23, 2012. We will stop at Petro to pick up skiers there and we will stop someplace (probably Rice Lake) for an evening meal arriving at Mountain Inn before 10 pm. Carol's cookies will come out after the Petro pickup.

Room assignments and tickets will be handed out as soon as we arrive. We have arranged for a **SHUTTLE** again and will provide details during the bus trip.

Dinner Friday night is on your own and most of us go to Lutsen Resort at the bottom of the hill on the main highway. We will provide transportation for all who want to go to the Resort for dinner.

Dinner Saturday night is a covered cost and we will arrange for that in a large room so we can all eat together and share ski stories.

Ski as much or as little as you wish Sunday morning (Feb. 26) at Lutsen. You will need to leave the hill by noon so you can clean up, change clothes and be ready to leave with the bus not later than 2 pm Sunday afternoon.

We simply reverse our course on the way home, looking for supper about 5 pm and making stops at Petro and then Dutch Mill Park & Ride before 10 pm Sunday night.

This is a fun trip ... relaxed ... easy on your nerves with excellent (usually) Midwest skiing (almost 1000' of vertical drop on Moose Mt.). **Sign up now!** See the Reservation Form on page 5.

Sunny skies and temperatures in the 30's were the order of the days for Madison Ski Club's sixth annual December trip to Snowmass. The glorious consistency was interrupted only by a mid-week squall that brought six inches of welcome fresh powder to the runs of the Aspen area's four mountains. Thirty-eight members of the club, from Wisconsin, Iowa, Minnesota, and England traveled by plane and train to enjoy the season's first tracks, fellowship, and fun.

Many who traveled by plane arrived at the ski-in, ski-out Mountain Chalet just in time for the Chalet's soup lunch on Saturday, and had the opportunity to check out the shops and surroundings during the afternoon. Train travelers arrived a bit later in the day, but still in time to get unpacked and acclimated before dinner.
