STEAMBOAT, COLORADO Sat. Feb. 4 - Fri. Feb. 10, 2012

It's "steamy" in Steamboat, but not the kind associated with the hot and humid summer we've had in Madison! We're talking about the vim and vigor you will get from skiing Steamboat's world famous "Champagne Snow" – 70% drier, 70% fluffier, 100% **fun**. Spread over 2965 acres, there are 165 trails to explore – 14% easiest, 42% intermediate, and 44% advanced. Its runs have produced more Winter Olympians (69) than any other resort in North America. You may even have a chance to ski with Billy Kidd, who still makes Steamboat his home.

Located 7000 feet up in the Colorado Rockies, Steamboat Springs is a bona fide ski town, nestled in one of the most beautiful valleys below one of the largest ski mountains in North America. With its 100 year heritage, Steamboat is self-described as "No Glitz, No Flash" - a shining example of what a ski resort should be. Its western heritage extends beyond the ski slopes. A stroll through Downtown Steamboat Springs reveals buildings dating back to the late 1800's and one of the area's more than 150 mineral It offers a small town friendliness and springs. hospitality with over 40 restaurants, 90 shops and galleries plus an historic walking tour. In addition, sleigh rides, cross country skiing, snowshoeing, snowmobile rides, dog sledding, hot springs and spa services, concerts, mountain dining, and more provide plenty to do off the slopes.

We will fly Madison to Steamboat with a short transfer to the Ptarmigan Inn, our "home" for the week. It is one of the best in the area, with ski in, ski out access located at the Gondola. It is a full service hotel, with in-room refrigerators, coffee makers, remote color cable televisions with VCRs and high speed Internet access, outdoor heated pool, hot tub and sauna, and complimentary valet ski storage. The Sportstalker Ski Shop is located at the Inn, for rental, equipment, and apparel needs. The Snowbird Restaurant and Lounge, located slope side in the hotel, allows you to dine while you watch the skiers go by. Après ski in the lounge with daily happy hour. For those trips into town, the Steamboat Springs city bus stop is located 100 yards from the Inn. A daily breakfast buffet is included in the price of the trip.

Price includes: round trip air (Madison – Hayden Field at Steamboat); airport shuttle to the hotel; 6 nights lodging (based on 2 sharing a room); 6 morning buffet breakfasts, tax & gratuities; in/out baggage handling and gratuities; all room and air taxes and maid gratuities. Not included are lift tickets (special Madison Ski Club prices to be announced), meals other than those listed above, and personal expenses.

PRICE: \$1577 per person, based on 2 persons sharing a room. A discount of \$50 will be given if a \$300 per person deposit if received by November 15. This special Madison Ski Club discount brings the price down to only **\$1527!** Single supplement is an additional \$945. Reservation form on page 7.

SNOWMASS COLORADO Saturday Dec 10 - Friday Dec 16, 2011



Snowmass, a Madison Ski Club Favorite, Filling Fast!

Popular demand has made 2011 the sixth consecutive year that Madison Ski Club has made Snowmass the first trip of the season. Save \$50 on the trip cost by sending your \$300 per-person deposit by September 15, 2011.

Snowmass is the second-largest ski area in the United States—3132 acres, with 91 trails serviced by 21 lifts. 50% of Snowmass's runs are wide, groomed, intermediate cruisers—perfect for those first days of the new season. 6% of Snowmass's slopes are beginner runs, and 44% are challenging expert slopes (with more than 4400 vertical feet of drop). A Snowmass lift ticket also entitles skiers to a free short shuttle ride for ski days at Aspen Highlands, Aspen Mountain and Buttermilk.

Our "home" for the week will be the Snowmass Mountain Chalet. Start each morning with a complimentary full hot breakfast overlooking a slope-side deck. Take advantage of the ski-in/skiout convenience to return for a complimentary lunch each day. The Living Room offers a lounge and fireplace for nightly cocktail parties, cards, games, and reading. Warm your toes and soothe your muscles at the end of the day in the outdoor hot tub and pool. Enjoy dining—and finish your holiday shopping—at the Village Mall nearby, or take a 15minute free shuttle ride to picturesque Aspen Village, with its many shops, galleries and dining spots.

Enjoy five days of great snow and uncrowded slopes, or take advantage of the area's many other activities. Enjoy the quieter side of nature on the Aspen/Snowmass Nordic System's 40 miles of nofee groomed trails for individual or guided crosscountry skiing or snowshoeing. Visit the Wapiti Wildlife Center, which offers free 45 minute nature tours. Check out the Anderson Ranch Arts Center, a working ranch now converted to an informal artists' collective.

It was 90 degrees outside today. How can I possibly be writing an article for a ski trip? The reason is that it is that time of the year already.

Think SNOW, bright blue skies and the backdrop of Lake Superior. Stretching out in front of you is a mile-long groomed run down Moose Mt. This can be your time, place and experience on February 23, 24, 25 and 26, 2012. This is the date of our next Lutsen Ski Trip.

We will repeat our format from last year because we think it was well received. This means that we leave the Dutch Mill Park & Ride at 2 pm on Thursday, Feb. 23. We continue our bus traditions (more detail on that in later articles) and arrive at the Mt. Inn at Lutsen about 10 pm that evening. We ski Lutsen all day Friday and Saturday and until noon on Sunday. We will leave Lutsen about 1:30 pm on Sunday and be back in Madison by about 10 pm Sunday night, Feb. 26.

We do not know pricing yet but we have been told that Mt. Inn will not be increasing their prices and that is good news. We still have to negotiate our contracts for tickets and the bus. I am optimistic that our prices will not change dramatically and of course we will tell you what they are as soon as we know them.

This is a great family ski weekend and we hope that we will see you again if you have skied with us before and we hope to see you for the first time if you have not done this trip before. This is a great time for kids and adults.

Bike Ride Sun. Sept 25 beginning at 10:00 am

Mark your calendars for 10 am on Sunday, September 25, 2011. This year we will ride the **Badger State Trail beginning at the parking lot** of Pacific Cycle (4902 Hammersley Rd, Madison). Our objective is to reach the <u>village</u> <u>park at Belleville</u> where we plan to have lunch. This trip is 14 miles <u>each</u> way for a total of 28 miles (roughly the same as past years). The benefit of this trip on this route is that if you decide at any time that you have expended half your energy, you can turn around and return to our Point of Beginning. Understand however, that this is NOT a race. It is a journey and we take our time to enjoy the ride.

The first 7 miles of this trip are paved. The paving stops at Purcell Rd. and it becomes a "standard" crushed limestone surface the rest of the way. Carol and I biked it on July 31 of this year and the surface is in good condition. This trail does require either an <u>annual or daily trail pass</u> which can be purchased while on the trail.

The scenery is vintage Wisconsin farm lands and animals and crops. At several points, there are rock outcroppings where blasting was done to maintain the grade for steam engines which used to run this trail on rails. As a result of this being a converted trail, there are no serious hills but rather gentle upgrades and downgrades. For those with "extra" energy after lunch, the main <u>tunnel</u> is about 6 miles south of Belleville. This would, of course, add 12 miles to the total trip but the tunnel is very interesting. If you think you might do that, be sure to bring a flashlight.

Regarding <u>lunch</u>, you could bring your own OR, as we come into Belleville, there is a "TownMart" just off the trail which caters to bikers. We can stop there to get sandwiches, something to drink, etc. to take to the park which is about half a mile from the store. As usual, Carol and I will provide a <u>trail-mix</u> of some sort for snacking along the way. We will, of course provide a <u>map</u> for each biker. Carol and I will each be on a bike (not our usual tandem) so we will be able to lead and help anyone who wants or needs it.

This is a <u>"rain or shine</u>" event and we have no delay date. It is either this date or we ride next year. So ... make your plans now, do a little practice riding and hope for good weather.
